I was recently asked if I remembered Elias A. Cohen and if I knew what he was really like. Like so many of us I never met him personally because I am too young to have done so. All that I know comes from the stories, occasional photo and the stuff of legends from over the years. As compared to today, there were no home videos, no sound movies and no tape recordings to create a picture of this man for us, the future generations who have benefitted from his foresight. This question also reminded me that as time goes by, fewer Tranquillity-ites remain who knew Pearl and her generation, first hand, as she ran all aspects of camp, 7x24x365, building upon her Uncle Elias's vision of what Tranquillity should be.

What I realized from this inquiry is that many now consider me and my contemporaries (you know who you are) as the new "elders" of Tranquillity, keepers of the values, the history and the wisdom that has been passed down to us starting nearly 100 years ago. This is not only a revelation for someone who still feels young and in touch, but it represents a huge responsibility. Some view us as we would like to be perceived, great experienced teachers who care about Tranquillity and Tranquillity-ites of all ages, while others view us as roadblocks to modernity. What I know is that all try their best, and all contribute from their hearts.

Richard Lawrence recently sent me a publication which was a compilation of articles written by Mr. Cohen, during the early 20th century, when Elias A. Cohen was a true leader of the Real Estate community in New York City. As such, he set the standard for ethical business behavior as this great city grew from 2 story buildings and undeveloped farms to a high rise business community. He worked with all of the historic greats of the New York financial world who looked to him with respect and honor. It gave me chills to see reference after reference about how he always had Tranquillity on his mind and incorporated requests for donations of money and building artifacts in his business deals. Reading the story of how he retrieved the fireplace bricks, chandeliers and sconces in what was then the Dining Room and now the TY House playroom, gave me the chills. The stories in his articles had a rhythm and feel that reminded me of how Pearl would speak to us. This was a history lesson about Tranquillity and New York, and it was all true!

Pearl was acutely aware of time and how experience passed from generation to generation. Her messages often used the expression "Tempus Fugit", Time Marches On. She also adopted the song title "Sunrise Sunset", from Fiddler on the Roof as part of her own Credo. Both Pearl and Mr. Cohen valued young people for their ability to influence younger campers. While Tranquility-ites view the continuous progression from camper to counselor to head counselor as natural, we are unique among camps. Most camps interrupt and stop your camp life at 16, while counselors and head counselors are mostly college educated adults.

Why do I focus on the subjects of time, youthful participation, and continuity? It is because we need increased participation in the Friends of Tranquillity Camp to pass the torch. Presidents and other officers should not hold their positions for 10+ years or until they are physically unable to perform. We need people of all ages to step up, learn from us, teach us and then take Tranquillity to its next generations of families, in the spirit of Mr. Cohen, Pearl and the many who followed them. We need volunteers to assist in our financial management, event planning, social media, fundraising and in re-defining how the Tranquillity community should interact in today's world. It takes time to learn and we are ready to move forward. It is simple. Just call or write to me and we will find a way for you to fulfill your personal dreams of "doing well at doing good". Our fundraising season is about to start. What better time to get involved!
